- ii. Registered Training Centres and Employers can only benefit from one of the schemes, either foreign expertise scheme or local training scheme for the same course / workshop / seminar / conference.
- iii. The course / workshop / seminar / conference should be conducted for a minimum of 15 participants and should be opened to the public.
- iv. Registered training centres and employers should have contributed levy for at least six months preceding the application.
