# 13. Bar Coding Acquisition System (BCAS)

#### Feature:

The purpose of the scheme is to provide grant up to Rs 10,000 for the acquisition of bar-coding system for up to 1000 products, so as to access premium markers like hypermarkets and export markets. The grant will also cover training of the agro processors in the Bar-Coding System.
